Adventist Community Services - 2010 Report

A busy year for Adventist Community Services

It has been a very busy year for us at ACS we have three new workers. Bea has agreed to be my assistant. Mary is still in our prayers and we hope to have her back in our little family soon. It is not complete without her.

The garden has been such a blessing. God has done a miracle in his garden, working for him have been Mervin and Orvella Ernest and many others under Mervin's leadership. The garden produced over 6,200 pounds of veggies. Our clients could come weekly for produce & many did.

From our food cupboard we feed 255 families; that amounted to 833 people in all. They were allowed to come in three times in the year. The market value of the food given was almost \$17,900. We gave away over 7,500 pounds of food. With the non perishable food and produce out food bank distributed over 13,700 pound of food. If my math is correct that is over 7 tons of food. Not bad for small church.

I thank you one and all for your support. I can tell you we didn't spend that much so God with your help preformed a miracle. The community services praise God and thank you!
